
هنگامی که «کمیته همکاری های عمومی اسرائیل آمریکایی» (AIPAC) در سال ۱۳۲۹ (۱۹۵۰ م) آغاز به کار کرد، تنها یک نام با این سازمان تازه شکل گرفته پیوند داشت؛ «سی کِنن» آ، مؤسس و اهل واشنگتن. امروز، آیپک ۶۵ هزار عضو در میان همه ۵۰ ایالت آمریکا دارد، کسانی که طلایه دار جبهه خشم انگیز ترین مسائلی هستند که امروز اسرائیل با آن مواجه است: متوقف کردن ایران از به دست آوردن سلاحهای هسته ای، نبرد با تروریسم و برقرار کردن صلح. و همه موارد فوق، ایجاب میکند که اسرائیل برای مواجه شدن با این چالش ها به اندازه کافی قدر تمند باشد.

به این دلائل، «نیویورک تایمز» آیپک را مهمترین سازمان مؤثر در روابط آمریکا با اسرائیل خوانده است، و در همین حال مجله «فورتیون» نیز هماهنگ با آن، آیپک را در میان قدرتمندترین و محبوبترین گروههای آمریکایی طبقهبندی کرده است.

فعالیتهای آیپک در ترتیب دادن بیش از دو هزار ملاقات با اعضای کنگره آمریکا، در خانه و یا در واشنگتن، کمک کرد که بیش از ۱۰۰ قانون ابتکاری و جدید به نفع اسرائیل در یک سال در کنگره تصویب شود. از به دست آوردن نزدیک به سه میلیارد دلار کمک برای امنیت اسرائیل گرفته تا کسب بودجه برای تلاشهای مشترک آمریکا و اسرائیل برای مقابله با سلاحهای غیر متعارف، اعضای آیپک در وخیمترین و بحرانی ترین اوضاع اسرائیل درگیر می باشند.

When the American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC) began in the 1950s, only one name was associated with the newly formed organization -- Si Kenen -- founder and Washingtonian. Today, AIPAC has 65,000 members across all 50 states who are at the forefront of the most vexing issues facing Israel today: stopping Iran from acquiring nuclear weapons, fighting terrorism and achieving peace. And above all, ensuring that Israel is strong enough to meet these challenges.

For these reasons, *The New York Times* has called AIPAC the most important organization affecting America's relationship with Israel, while *Fortune* magazine has consistently ranked AIPAC among America's most powerful interest groups.

Through more than 2,000 meetings with members of Congress - at home and in Washington - AIPAC activists help pass more than 100 pro-Israel legislative initiatives a year. From procuring nearly \$3 billion in aid critical to Israel's security, to funding joint U.S.-Israeli efforts to build a defense against unconventional weapons, AIPAC members are involved in the most crucial issues facing Israel.

Activists work closely with AIPAC's professional staff, people drawn from the top echelons of government, diplomacy, academia and politics. AIPAC lobbyists meet every member of Congress and cover every hearing on Capitol Hill that touches on the U.S.-Israel relationship. AIPAC policy experts each day review hundreds of periodicals, journals, speeches and reports and meet regularly with the most innovative foreign policy thinkers in order to track and analyze events and trends.

Professionals in AIPAC's regional offices reach out to activists in hundreds of communities each year from Missoula, Montana, to Miami, Florida. Whether meeting in a neighbor's living room, attending a ballroom gala or participating in an AIPAC conference in Washington, AIPAC activists receive the most up-to-date analyses of Middle East issues and American politics.

For more than two decades, AIPAC's Political Leadership Development Program has educated and trained young leaders in pro-Israel advocacy, and encouraged them to become politically active. Students involved with AIPAC learn how to effectively advocate for a strong U.S.-Israel relationship, bring their Members of Congress to campus, promote voter registration, work on political campaigns, and build relationships with other student leaders.

Stopping Iran From Acquiring Nuclear Weapons

Despite legislative efforts to stop the flow of dangerous technologies to Iran, intelligence experts concur that it is likely to have nuclear, biological and chemical weapons and the missiles to deliver them within a few years. AIPAC works with Congress to enact even more comprehensive legislation to contain Iran and to expand U.S.-Israel strategic cooperation to build a defense against this threat.

Standing By Israel to Ensure the Security of the Only Democracy in the Middle East

America must continue to stand by Israel's side politically, diplomatically and economically. Not only is U.S. aid needed to maintain Israel's security during this dangerous and challenging time in the country's history, but aid to Israel supports a reliable, front-line ally in our joint battle against weapons proliferation and terrorism. AIPAC engages Congress to support Israel.

Defending Israel Against Tomorrow's Threats

In future wars, Israel will face the specter of nuclear, biological and chemical weapons delivered by long-range missiles, threats for which no defense yet exists. The costs of developing new systems to keep Israel safe in the next century will be considerable -- and American support, critical. AIPAC works with Congress to increase military assistance to Israel and to strengthen cooperative defense programs to counter these emerging threats.

Preparing the Next Generation of Pro-Israel Leaders

The challenges for today's students are enormous -- fewer Jewish youth than ever identify with Israel, average student turnout in recent elections is only 25 percent and anti-Israel activity on campus is rising. AIPAC trains and educates pro-Israel students across America and develops their leadership skills so that they become effective citizen lobbyists today and pro-Israel leaders tomorrow.

Educating Congress About the U.S.-Israel Relationship

Two-thirds of the House has been elected during this past decade, one in every three senators is in his or her first term and more than 2,000 candidates likely will run for federal office in the

next two years. AIPAC educates all of them about the importance of the U.S.-Israel relationship. To complete this task, we must expand our unparalleled network of activists by traveling to communities both large and small in all 50 states.

What We've Recently Achieved

AIPAC worked with Congress to...

Counter Terrorism Aimed at the United States and Israel

- Isolate Hamas, Hezbollah and Palestinian Islamic Jihad by advocating that the Administration place the terrorist groups on a more restrictive terrorist list, allowing the United States to sanction foreign financial institutions if they fail to block the organizations' assets.
- Disrupt Hamas financing by urging the Administration to freeze the assets of the U.S.based Holy Land Foundation, which has been accused of funneling money to the terrorist organization.
- Defend Israel from terrorist bomb attacks by securing \$28 million for Israel to purchase American technology, including robots and scanners, designed to detect and neutralize bombs.

Pressure Arafat to Stop Violence

- Pressure Palestinian Authority Chairman Yasir Arafat to fight terrorism by passing legislation urging the President to impose sanctions on Arafat if he fails to dismantle Palestinian terrorist groups.
- Urge the Administration, through overwhelmingly passed resolutions and two letters—both signed by 89 senators—to cut off U.S. relations with Yasir Arafat and the PA if he fails to fight terrorism.
- Press for an end to incitement by halting U.S. assistance to the Palestinian Broadcasting Corporation until it stops its anti-peace and anti-Israel broadcasts.

Enhance U.S.-Israel Strategic Cooperation to Meet New Threats

- Safeguard Israel from the emerging ballistic missile threat by boosting funding for the Arrow—the world's most advanced operational missile defense system—and securing a five-year commitment by the Administration to fund the program.
- Ensure faster delivery of Arrow missiles to Israel and provide important missile defense technology to the United States by opening the way for the creation of an Arrow production facility in the United States.
- Protect Israel from short-range rockets such as the Katyusha—hundreds of which have rained down upon towns in northern Israel in recent years—by continuing the funding and development of the Tactical High Energy Laser, which, once deployed, can destroy low-flying rockets at close ranges.
- Help the U.S. war against terrorism by securing funding to acquire Israeli-developed Have Nap, which were used in Afghanistan to destroy Osama bin Laden's network of underground bunkers.
- Improve the accuracy of American airstrikes by securing funding for the development and acquisition of advanced navigational and targeting systems such as the Israeli-

Delay Iran's Nuclear Weapons Program

- Block foreign investment in Iran's oil sector—its principle method of financing nuclear weapon development—through the overwhelming renewal of the Iran-Libya Sanctions Act for an additional five years.
- Interrupt the flow of dangerous missile technologies to Iran by passing legislation to sanction foreign companies that help its missile program.
- Press the Russian government to end its weapons cooperation with Iran by withholding up to 50 percent of needed U.S. aid.

Strengthen Israel Through Military and Economic Aid

- Reinforce our commitment to Israel and support its security infrastructure by providing nearly \$3 billion in aid, while refocusing that assistance to meet Israel's changing security needs.
- Help Israel absorb new immigrants from the former Soviet Union by providing \$60 million in refugee assistance.
- Recognize Israel's singular needs by granting unique early disbursal of aid—all assistance is received 30 days after the passage of the foreign aid bill.

Broaden the U.S.-Israel Relationship

- Educate lawmakers and their staffs about the complicated issues facing Israel and the region by organizing substantive congressional trips to Israel through AIPAC's supporting educational foundation.
- Reaffirm the core value that forever binds the United States and Israel—democracy—by passing a resolution in the House by a vote of 410-1 applauding Israel's recent democratic elections and restating the U.S. commitment to Israel's security.

Protect Jerusalem as the Capital of Israel

- Fight to recognize Jerusalem as Israel's undivided capital on all official U.S. documents—including maps and passports—and place the consulate in Jerusalem under the supervision of the U.S. Embassy, rather than reporting directly to Washington.
- Pressure the Administration to move the U.S. Embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem—as
 called for in the Jerusalem Embassy Relocation Act—through legislation, letters and
 meetings.

End Israel's Isolation in World Bodies

- Secure Israel's acceptance into the West European and Others regional group at the United Nations.
- Encourage the Administration to boycott the U.N. World Conference Against Racism, which was used as a forum to spread anti-Israel and anti-Semitic views.
- Press the International Committee for the Red Cross to accept Israel's Magen David Adom by passing legislation prohibiting U.S. assistance to the committee's headquarters until Magen David Adom is allowed to participate in the organization's activities.
